Indoor Exercise

Whether its riding the tricycle, doing adaptive yoga, or a workout video, this session allows participants of all abilities to get some physical activity in their day.

Computer Skills

Aimed at helping individuals explore their individual interests and become more independent online, this group uses the computer to learn how to look up information online and share information about topics of interest with friends, family, and care givers, while remaining safe.

Games & Puzzels

A variety of games and puzzles are offered each week for participants to choose from. Whether its Uno, Guess Who, or other activities, participants work on socialization and collaboration.

Corn Hole

Great for gross motor skills, physical activity, math skills, and just having fun! Corn hole participants practice together and compete in teams of 2 to reach 21 points before the other team.

Money Skills

Focusing on both in center and practical applications, money skills works with participants to recognize different money amounts, budget for different wants and needs, and practice purchasing items.



Music

Whether its singing solos or singing as a group, playing an instrument, or sharing music they enjoywith their friends, this activity allows participants to enjoy time together and express themselves through music. This group will be invited to join the Loveland Creates performance in December for a small cameo.

Library

At the public library participants have the opportunity to interact with their community while choosing books they would like to read at program or at home. Staff supports participants to check books out as independently as possible.

Daily Living Skills

Whether its practicing folding laundry, how to organize a room, or put away dishes, this session focuses on different skills that help individuals live as independently as possible.

Sports

This session focuses on taking care of your physical and mental health. Interactive activities, such as going for a walk at a park, when to go to the doctor, or practicing stress management techniques are all part of this session.

Cultural Exploration

Grocery Shopping

Reading

With support from staff, participants in reading select a book from the library to read together and then discuss the book as a group. Books vary depending on the participants involved and different participants are given the lead to choose throughout the session.

Dance Exercise

Whether its standing or in a chair, dance exercise is a great way to take care of your body and have fun at the same time!

Rehearsal

Those cast in the fall/winter performance have rehearsal on Monday, Wednesday, and Thursday mornings with our guest director, Liz Pascoe. Through rehearsing and performing participants learn how to work together, be creative, follow directions, memorize lines, improvize, and so much more.

Art Creation

The Loveland Store houses art made by participants in the Loveland Creates program. In Art Creation, participants learn how to make new types of art that can be sold. When they find a type of art they like they can keep working on that style, creating pieces for the store. Participants keep the profits of any piece of art that they sell,

Loveland Creates is a specialized program where participants learn life skills through visual and performing arts.

Scene Shop

Loveland's state of the art shop is built with safety in mind first. in our weekly Scene Shop activity, participants help to design, build, and paint scenery for the current production. Through this process, participants learn how to problem solve, work as a team, safely use tools, and create something they are proud of.

Loveland Store Sales

As part of the hands on learning of the Loveland Creates program, participants learn all aspects of entrepreneurship. In this activity, participants manage the inventory for the store, update the store's Etsy shop, package and ship orders, and more.

Marketing & Sponsorships

Making sure the community knows about an upcoming production and gathering their support is vital to its success! Participants learn how to market a show, take posters to local businesses, learn why sponsorships are important, and even call businesses asking if they will support the show.

Community Outings

Outings vary week to week based on the needs of the participants and the program. They can be going to home depot to pick up supplies, taking a break at the beach, gathering research for a set by looking at architecture around town, and so much more.



Lighting

In this activity, participants learn how to design, cable, hang, and focus lighting equipment for theatrical performances. Additionally, participants learn how to opperate the lighting board, record cues, and more. Through this activity participants learn how to use non-verbal communication, work as a team, and follow directions.

Wood Shop

Similar to scene shop, Wood Shop has participants learning wood working skills, creating pieces that can be shared or sold. Potential projects include bird houses, cutting boards, custom signs, and more.

Sound

In this activity, participants learn how to design, cable, and run sound equipment for theatrical productions. Participants lear how to balance sounds, listen closely for changes, and make changes quickly.

Music

In this activity participant learn music for upcoming performance or share songs they are working on individually with each other.

Costumes & Make Up

Participants learn how to research, design, shop for, and sew costumes. Studying a character's clothing choices helps participants learn non-verbal communication, while the practical life skills of sewing and staying on budget are also important parts of this program.

Hearty Kitchen Academy

A specialized micro program within building C, individuals who sign up for the Hearty Kitchen Academy are signing up to be learning life skills through food every day they attend program.

Volunteering

Working with a local food pantry or food bank, participants learn the importance of giving back, about food insecurity, and gain first hand expereince sorting and preparing food to be distributed. Food bank and pantries vary week to week and can include working with All Faith's Food Bank, The Awaken Food Pantry, and more.

Shopping

Cooking starts long before the stove is turned on. We like to say that we don't have magic refrigerators at program. Participants learn organizational, preparation, and money skills during weekly shopping trips to purchase the ingredients needed to prepare meals at program.

HKA activities include: Gardening Cool

We believe that learning where our food comes from is invaluable. During gardening, participants learn to take care of the fruits and vegetables in Loveland's kitchen garden, harvesting the ingredients when they are ready to be used in a meal.

Cooking The meat and potatoes of the HKA program, where it all comes together! **During regular** cooking sessions participants learn how to make meals and snacks they want to make at home. During cooking for residents, participants learn how to cook in bulk making hot meals for residents of the Nancy Detert Apartments.

Kitchen Reset & Prep Learning about cooking means learning every part including taking care of your space. During Kitchen reset & prep participants learn how to deep clean kitchen appliances, go through the firdge to see what food needs to be discarded, take inventory of supplies, and prepare for the next cooking project.

Monday Mentors

Focused on connecting program participants with members of the community, Monday Mentors offers a interaction with a variety of volunteers who teach new skills about independent living, job skills, sports, and more while building connections with participants.

Social Skills

Using a variety of hands on learning activities, social skills offers program participants the opportunity to grow with their peers. Whether its role playing different social scenarios or learning how to host a dinner party, social skills activities are based on the specific needs and goals of the individuals in the group.

Pick one activity per morning and afteroon time slot on days you attend program.

Mural Painting

Working as a team, participants in mural painting with spend 4 months designing & implementing an 8 foot by 8 foot mural that will hang in the hallway of building C. Designed to help build collaborative social skills, work on problem solving, and explore creative expression.

Karate

Lead by Buck Buckmaster of Revolutionary Martial Arts in Venice, participants go to the Karate studio 1 to 2 times per week. Through Karate, participants learn self discipline while building strength and confidence..

Gardening

Gardening helps participants learn how to take care of the spaces around them, connect with nature, learn about different plants, and work as a team. Whether its planting new flowers, weeding, watering, painting rocks or pots, gardening allows participants to explore the world around them.

Reading

With support from staff, participants in reading select a book from the library to read together and then discuss the book as a group. Books vary depending on the participants involved and different participants are given the lead to choose throughout the session.



Corn Hole

Great for gross motor skills, physical activity, math skills, and just having fun! Corn hole participants practice together and compete in teams of 2 to reach 21 points before the other team.

Kick Ball participants practice and play together in the quad area of the Venice Campus or at local baseball fields. Participants in this activity are working on physical activity/ health, following directions, team work, and socialization.

Money Skills

Basketball

Basketball participants practice and play together in the quad area of the Venice Campus or at local parks. Participants in this activity are working on physical activity/ health, following directions, team work, and socialization.

Spanish

Focused on conversational interactions participants may have with friends, family, and caregivers who are spanish speakers.
